ABOUT THE COMMITTEE

According to the Official Organization of the Olympic Games, the main objective of the (IOC) is to defend and lead the sports movement. It's an organization located in different parts of the world, which seeks to create a relationship between athletes, organizations, federations, and dissemination partners. All this with the main goal of creating a close bond of understanding to create a better world through sports.

Day by day, the IOC works to provide solutions and promote what the UN says, adding sport in between. Its members are 102 active, 43 honoraries, and one honorary member. The founding countries of this organization are Argentina, Austrian Empire-Bohemia, Belgium, United States of America, France, United Kingdom, Greece, Hungary, Italy, New Zealand, Russian Empire, and Sweden.

It is a committee focused on taking advantage of all the potential that sport has and exploiting it in the world to generate environments of peace and inclusion. The (IOC) is not only focused on sports, it also supports humanity and strives to provide them opportunities without judging them for their character, beliefs, appearance, or any other characteristics related to their person.

This commission is largely linked to the Olympic Games, and thanks to them, this organization has increased. At the time the Olympic Games were restored (June 23, 1894), this group was created to protect the committee and those who were part of it. In the year 2020, an "Olympic Charter" was created to project information about the sets and rules that this committee must follow to achieve better functioning of it. The established rules are not completely directed to countries, rather, they deal with issues that may arise with the resolution of problems. The only rule that must be complied with at all times by each one of the countries, is the fact of giving freedom to society to participate in sporting events and not judge them based on personal prejudices.

The IOC distributes more than 90% of its income to countries around the world that have Olympic movements, intending to achieve a Global Sports Culture. TOPIC A: LGBTQ+ 's rights in sports competitions

Currently, the LGBTQ+ community has gained great popularity in all media. The community is characterized by feeling physically, emotionally, and sexually attracted to people of the same gender or one more. L: lesbians, G: gay, B: bisexuals, T: transgenders and transsexuals Q: "queer". Here we find two very important, being transgender and transexual.

The difference between transgender and transexual is that transgenders change their diversity of without changing their given, and transexuals undergoes a medical procedure in order to change sexual organs. Correspondingly, both adopt behaviors and attitudes. Over time the field of sport has been mainly led by men, however little by little society has had different social and regulatory changes which consequently created fair and equal decisions for both men and women. In sport, we can find two branches, men's and women's branches.

Already mentioned before, society has had social changes, among them women have stood out since over time they have given great struggles for an egalitarian society. In the women's branch, we can find renowned athletes such as Serena Williams, who remains the current number one in the sport of tennis. We can also mention other great women such as Ada Hegerberg, Norwegian soccer player playing as "forward" for Olympique Lyon. In 2018, she became the first player to win the Ballon of Gold.

Now let's move on to the Men's branch, in the men's branch we find Cristiano Ronaldo, a Portuguese soccer player for the "United" team, going from a contact sport only with the feet, we find Lebron James, a professional basketball player for the "Lakers".

The field of sport is quite extensive, it contains countless branches; even though the sport has two sections, there are still issues as there are restrictions on transgender and transexual athletes.

This has been generating great controversy, to the point where it has been considered discrimination simply because of their sexual orientation. The moment someone makes this big decision to change their gender or sex, they are exposed to different physical, mental, and emotional changes. "No one is against trans women or their inclusion in sport, but not at the cost of overriding the gender-based categories that sport is based on and needs" (FE, 2022) explains Irene Aguilar legal advisor. The debate is that it is believed that when competing with a trans person (example: trans woman) they benefit from the effects of testosterone. Some people think this debate it's required while others consider it's small-mindedness way for transgender people.

Topic B Safety of athletes in the context of armed conflicts

We live in an unpredictable world and since ancient times, there have been various conflicts between nations for different interests of a political, religious, or cultural nature. However, throughout these years, the sport has served as a tool for peace. All of them bring multiple benefits such as effort, self-improvement, perseverance, equality, health, respect, and solidarity.

According to the UN (2015), there is a Greek tradition called "ekecheiria" in which war conflicts were temporarily suspended, so athletes could participate in the Olympic Games held in a peaceful and safe environment. In 1992, the International Olympic Committee continued that tradition, calling on all countries to observe the Olympic Truce. In addition, the General Assembly urged the Member States to uphold this Olympic peace. Since then, support for the Olympic Truce has grown steadily to unprecedented and unanimous cosponsorship.

Currently, the Olympic Truce has functioned as diligence to build a better world based on the rules of fair competition, humanity, and conciliation. Furthermore, it is a link between this ancient tradition and the overall goal of the United Nations to maintain peace and security among nations.

On the other hand, there are precedents where the safety of athletes had been affected, such as the event known as "Black September" that occurred in 1972, where 11 Israeli athletes were killed during the Munich Olympics. On September 5, a commando of 8 terrorists forcibly entered the apartments of the Israeli Olympic team in the Olympic village. During the assault two of the athletes were killed and the terrorists took nine hostages. The games were immediately suspended. A few hours later, the German security forces decided to intervene in a rescue operation that turned out to be disastrous. All the hostages, five terrorists and a policeman were killed. After an intense discussion, the IOC decided that the games would continue with the realization of a ceremony of remembrance and tribute to the murdered athletes.

In the current environment, the conflict between Russia and Ukraine presented as a consequence, a breach of the Olympic Truce, since it began on Friday, February 4 of this year, seven days before the Beijing 2022 Winter Olympics, so it had to be extended until the end of March. According to the UN (2022), this event has registered more than 10 thousand civilian casualties, with an accelerated humanitarian deterioration, women in particular face immense difficulties in terms of health, safety and access to food. In addition, this situation has negatively fueled a displacement crisis in Ukraine of a quarter of the population with twelve million people. Furthermore, the United Nations General Assembly passed a resolution condemning Russia's invasion of Ukraine in an extraordinary emergency session. The document was ratified by 141 of the United Nations' 193 member countries. The text "condems" Russia's aggression against Ukraine and "demands" that Moscow put an end to it and withdraw its troops from the neighboring country immediately and unconditionally. However, the resolution is not binding.



The IOC (2022) was forced to take action for the safety of athletes coming from both countries. They made an important announcement, saying: "Of all the participants, the IOC Executive Committee recommends that the Federations International Sports and the organizers of sports events do not invite or allow the participation of Russian and Belarusian athletes and officials in international competitions." (IOC, 2022).

Lastly, despite the fact there have been events where the safety of athletes has been broken in different countries, the IOC uses sports as a way to fully protect athletes and not put them at risk while conflicts occur through the Olympic Truce. These types of events serve as an experience to reinforce the safety of athletes and use sport as a tool for peace which is a human right that should not be broken for any reason.

Key questions:

- Is there any conflict in your country that compromises the safety of athletes?
- What does your country do to guarantee the safety of the athletes?
- What other measures besides the Olympic Truce could be taken to increase the safety of the athletes in your country?
